



Grades reflect the quality and quantity of students' work submitted throughout the term according to the grading standards listed below. Undergraduate- and graduate-credit students may earn the following grades:

A and A- grades represent work whose superior quality indicates a full mastery of the subject. An A represents work of extraordinary distinction.

B+, B, and B- grades represent work of good to very good quality throughout the term; however, it does not merit special distinction.

C+ , C, and C- grades indicate an average command of the course material.

D grades indicate work that shows a deficiency in knowledge of the material.

F is a failing grade representing work that deserves no credit. This grade may also be assigned to students who do not submit required work in courses from which they have not officially withdrawn by the withdrawal deadline.
